Vocations

The Gift of Mission is an interactive vocation awareness program, which is brought to young people through the National Religious Vocation Conference (NRVC). The vision of the NRVC is “to set the world ablaze with the fire of God’s love through the prophetic, joyful witness of religious sisters, brothers, and priests as radical disciples of Jesus.” This program, in practice since 2010 was suspended during the Covid-19 pandemic. However, at the current time, as Covid subsides in some areas, members of the NRVC were asked to revive the program and they responded positively to an invitation to present about their religious vocations.

Sister Maryanne Tracey, SC and Shannon Hoffman were part of a Vocation Team who presented a Program to 18 students from Villa Joseph Maria High School in Southampton Pennsylvania. The students were excited to learn about the wide variety of vocational ministry opportunities that are available to them.


